

Purdy® Brush Handle Types

Brush types are dictated by handle, ferrules and filaments.

Some completed brush heads are so popular that they will have multiple handle styles. A good example of this is the “Glide” style. In the Glide version, it has what is known as a Fluted handle

Handle style and brush preference is all about personal preference

Rattail handle Dale style angular trim brush.
Small handle for smaller hands. Smaller brush head for doing fine intricate work. Not a production tool.

Fluted handle for Glide style tools. Long medium size handle. Very versatile size. Most popular angular trim brush.

Glide- angular trim brush. Bow- straight sash brush.

Production tool- Increased reach when cutting in off a ladder. Less trips up and down the ladder.

Beavertail for larger hands. Sprig Style (straight trim brush), Swan Style (wall brush), XL High Capacity. Production tool.

Stubby handle. Available on the Cub. Great for work in confined spaces like cabinets.

Same brush head as the Glide.
